



BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MINUTES January 10, 2017

The Cherry County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on January 10, 2017, as per notice in the Valentine Midland News, with the agenda being on file in the office of the County Clerk. Roll call was taken; present at this meeting were County Commissioners: Jim Van Winkle, Tanya Storer, Martin DeNaeyer and Cherry County Clerk, Tom Elliott. Also present were Twyla Witt, Jim Ducey, Carolyn Semin, and later Gail Herrmann.

It was the consensus of the Board to allow Commissioner Van Winkle to conduct the meeting until reorganization. The meeting was called to order at 10:00 AM by acting- Chairman Van Winkle. The Open Meetings Act Notice was announced by acting Chairman Van Winkle. The minutes of the last regular meeting were read. Commissioner Storer moved to approve minutes as read with an amendment to Item D of the update to the Road Department Employee handbook to state that "Cherry County requests comp hours to be used in the pay period accrued". Commissioner Van Winkle seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. The motion carried.

The minutes of the meeting of The Board of Corrections held December 27, 2016 were read. Commissioner Storer moved to approve the minutes as read. Commissioner Van Winkle seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. The motion carried.

The Board conducted the Annual Reorganization Meeting. Commissioner Van Winkle moved to elect Commissioner Storer as the Chairman of the Board for 2017. Commissioner DeNaeyer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Van Winkleave. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Storer-abstain. The motion carried.

Commissioner DeNaeyer moved to designated Jim Van Winkle as Vice Chairperson for 2017. Commissioner Storer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye.

Commissioner Storer moved that for 2017 the Commissioners serve in the positions as follows: Keya Paha/Cherry County Housing Authority Board — Commissioner DeNaeyer, Region IV/Northstar Development Board — Commissioner Van Winkle, Region 4/Behavioral Health System Board — Commissioner Storer, County Welfare Chairman — Commissioner Van Winkle, Road District #1 Supervisor — Commissioner Van Winkle, Road District #2 Supervisor — Commissioner DeNaeyer, Road District #3 Supervisor — Commissioner Storer, Cherry County Highway Superintendent — Lloyd Smith, Niobrara Council — Commissioner Storer, Northwest Community Action Board — Commissioner DeNaeyer, North Central District Health Department — Commissioner Storer, Region 24 Emergency Management Board — Commissioner DeNaeyer, and CNEDD Board — Commissioner Van Winkle. Commissioner Van Winkle seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. The motion carried.

Commissioner Van Winkle moved that the following banks be used by the Cherry County Treasurer as depositories for County funds, as long as adequate funds are pledged to secure deposits, and to authorize the Cherry County Treasurer to invest County funds in accounts, such as CDs, for the benefit of the County: Bank of the West, Union Bank & Trust, Security First Bank, Wells Fargo Bank, NPAIT, and Pinnacle Bank. Commissioner Storer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. The motion carried.

Commissioner Van Winkle moved that Valentine Midland News and the Cherry County website be designated as the official publishers for advertising meeting notices and other communications for 2017. Commissioner Storer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. The motion carried.

It was the consensus of the Board to authorize Commissioner Van Winkle to serve as the Board's liaison to the Cherry County Justice Center.

County Treasurer Kathy Hammond addressed the Board regarding the need to update some furnishings and computer equipment in her office and to suggest obtaining a postage meter. It was the consensus of the Board to have the Treasurer purchase a new computer and to get quotes on the furniture and postage meter.

Jim Ducey discussed the "I am Nebraska" project that is part of the recognition of the 150th anniversary of the State of Nebraska's statehood. He asked for permission to use a room in the old Courthouse to conduct interviews if necessary. It was the consensus of the Board to make the room available as well as suggesting a couple of other possible locations.

Zoning Administrator Joel Mundorf addressed the Board regarding the most recent Planning Commission meeting, an upcoming NPZA workshop, and Planning Commission and Board of Adjustment members' terms to expire in 2017. No Board action was required at this time.

The Board reviewed annual cost-of-living increases for 2017. Commissioner Van Winkle moved to provide a 3% cost-of-living increase to Cherry County employees' salaries and wages other than elected County Officials whose salaries were set by the Board's 2013 salary resolution for the current term and the respective deputy salaries prescribed by State Statute. Commissioner DeNaeyer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. The motion carried.

Rose Chappell met with the Board to discuss the Sandhills Rescue Ambulance located in Merriman. Brent Peterson, Kay Reese, Sam Day, Vince Lopez and Gary Weaver were also present for the discussion. The lack of certified EMT's and first responders in the area was reviewed. Options for increasing staffing or siting the ambulance elsewhere were discussed. It was the consensus of the Board to contact other service providers to the area and continue to try to provide the ambulance if possible.

At 3:00 PM, as advertised, the Board recessed to convene as a Board of Corrections.

The Board returned to regular session at 4:08 PM.

County Attorney Eric Scott provide the Board with an update on NEOC complaints filed by two county employees. He stated that the situation may require the assistance of additional employment law counsel. It was the consensus of the Board to authorize the County Attorney to employ John Corrigan to assist with the NEOC complaints against the County.

The Board reviewed bank account reconciliations for the Health Fund and Imprest Fund.

The Board reviewed the Sheriff's fee report for the period October-December 2016.

The Board reviewed the fee report from the Clerk of the District Court for the month of December.

The Board discussed a proposed amendment to the bereavement leave portion of the County employee personnel policy.

Commissioner Van Winkle moved to adopt the amended language for the bereavement leave policy as presented for the Cherry County Employees handbook. Commissioner DeNaeyer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. The motion carried



January 10, 2017

The Cherry County Board of Commissioners met as a Board of Corrections at 3:00 PM, as per notice in the Valentine Midland News, on January 10, 2017. The Open Meetings Act was referenced by Chairman Storer and the Open Meetings Act poster was acknowledged. Present for the meeting were Cherry County Commissioners: Tanya Storer, Jim Van Winkle, and Martin DeNaeyer, Cherry County Clerk, Thomas E Elliott. Also, present were Lieutenant Krista Ostransky, David Stoeger, Shari Dixon, Sam Day, County Attorney Eric Scott and Carolyn Semin.

Lieutenant Krista Ostransky presented a current financial report for the Justice Center and an employee pay scale record. She discussed some in-house training and the criteria that employees must meet for advancement.

It was the consensus of the Board that future pay adjustments for Justice Center employees will require authorization from two or more Board of Corrections members.

County Attorney Eric Scott advised that no trainings should ever include or involve inmates.

Lieutenant Ostransky provided the Board with copies of correspondence received from Justice Center staff. It was the consensus of the Board to forward the letters to the County Attorney.

It was the consensus of the Board to table policy and procedure updates to the next meeting.

At 4:08 PM, Chairman Storer declared the Board of Corrections meeting adjourned.



BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MINUTES January 31, 2017

The Cherry County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on January 31, 2017 at 10:00 AM, as per notice in the Valentine Midland News, with the agenda being on file in the office of the County Clerk. Roll call was taken. Present at this meeting were Cherry County Commissioners: Jim Van Winkle, Tanya Storer, and Martin DeNaeyer and Cherry County Clerk, Tom Elliott. Also present were Jim Ducey, Twyla Witt, Ann Warren, and Gail Herrmann.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 AM by Chairman Storer. The Open Meetings Act Notice was announced and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. The minutes of the last regular meeting were read. Commissioner Van Winkle moved to approve minutes as read. Commissioner DeNaeyer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. The motion carried.

The minutes from the January 10, 2017 Board of Corrections meeting were read. Commissioner Van Winkle moved to approve the minutes as read. Commissioner DeNaeyer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. The motion carried.

Spencer Thomas and Ray Meyer presented a quarterly update of the County's health insurance plan. They discussed some possible changes to the Affordable Care Act, Meritain enhancements, and summarized the County's current plan design. No Board action was required.

Jim Ducey addressed the Board regarding an error in the legal description published in the legal notice for a C.U.P. hearing for a Verizon wireless tower proposed near Crookston. It was the consensus of the Board to discuss the matter with the Zoning Administrator and with the County Attorney.

County Sheriff Rusty Osburn presented an agreement that would continue a mutual aid law enforcement arrangement in the area.

Commissioner Storer moved to renew the Interlocal Agreement between Cherry County and a group of cooperating agencies along Highway 20 for providing law enforcement services. Commissioner Van Winkle seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. The motion carried.

Sheriff Osburn also requested permission to obtain bids for a new vehicle. It was the consensus of the Board to authorize the Sheriff to obtain bids to be presented to the Board for review.

Mike Bateman from Murphy Tractor & Equipment Co introduced new branch manager Joe Blanke to the Board. Mr. Blanke is in the Gering office and will oversee this area for John Deere equipment.

Commissioner Van Winkle moved to renew Lease No. 7754 for sand, gravel, and white subsoil with the State of Nebraska BELF in part of Sec. 16, T33N, R27W. Commissioner DeNaeyer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. The motion carried.

Commissioner Van Winkle moved to accept Martin DeNaeyer's written resignation from the Cherry County Board of Adjustments. Commissioner Storer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. The motion carried.

Commissioner Storer moved to reappoint Todd Mathis, John Wheeler, and Lynell Stillwell to the Cherry County Planning Commission to new terms to expire January 11, 2020. Commissioner DeNaeyer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. The motion carried.

Commissioner Storer moved to appoint Will Fischer to the Cherry County Board of Adjustments. Commissioner Van Winkle seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. Commissioner Storeraye. The motion carried.

The Board considered some options for obtaining secretarial services to assist the Planning Commission. It was the consensus of the Board to research the issue further.

At 1:00 PM Chairman Storer opened the meeting to public comment. Jim Ducey requested access to a room on the second floor of the old courthouse to conduct interviews and record oral histories on February 8, 15, and 22. It was the consensus of the Board to allow Mr. Ducey to use the room as requested.

County Surveyor Lloyd Smith informed the Board that the annual one and six year road hearing is scheduled for 2:00 PM on February 28. He also stated that supplemental agreements related to the Niobrara River road project had been received and would be included on the Board's agenda for the February 14th meeting.

County Treasurer Kathy Hammond asked permissions to rehire Kay Schleve on a part-time basis and stated that her copy machine needed replaced. It was the consensus of the Board to agree with both matters.

Noxious Weed Superintendent Barb Small provided the Board with year-end noxious weed infestation reports, a budget report, and a control plan for 2017. It was the consensus of the Board to authorize that Chairman to sign the reports required to be submitted to the Nebraska Department of Agriculture. Mrs. Small also suggested that an annual resolution regarding 10-day notices be approved by the Board and signed by the Chairman.

Commissioner Van Winkle moved to reappoint Commissioner Storer to the Area Agency on Aging Governing Board and to reappoint Herb Pabst as the Board's alternate. Commissioner DeNaeyer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storeraye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. The motion carried.

The Board reviewed a draft copy of an updated job description for the County Zoning Administrator.

The Board discussed the NPZA conference scheduled for March 8-10 and reported on recent meetings attended by them.

At 3:00 PM, as advertised, the Board recessed from regular session to convene as a Board of Corrections.

At 4:30 PM the Board returned to regular session.

County Assessor Betty Daugherty provided the Board with an update on proposed agland valuations for 2017. She discussed the 3-year sales roster required to be used by State Statute and some changes being proposed by Governor Ricketts. No Board action was required.

At 5:00 PM the Board recessed from regular session to reconvene as a Board of Corrections.

At 6:15 PM the Board returned to regular session.

The Board reviewed the inventory statement of real estate owned by Cherry County as of January 12, 2017. It was the consensus of the Board to approve the inventory statement.

County Attorney Eric Scott updated the Board on two complaints filed with the NEOC. No Board action was required at this time.

Commissioner Van Winkle moved to approve claims. Commissioner Storer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Van Winkle-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. The motion carried.




The Board of Corrections minutes from the March 28, 2017 meeting were read and approved during regular session.

The Board reviewed the Sheriff's quarterly fee report for the first quarter of 2017.





At 1:00 PM, as advertised, the Board recessed from regular session to convene as a Board of Equalization.


At 1:20 PM, the Board returned to regular session.

Communications Director Gary Weaver addressed the Board regarding maintenance on communications towers and the Justice Center. No Board action was required.





At 5:10 PM the Board returned to regular session.


