The meeting was called to order at 10:03 AM by Chairman Storer. Roll call was taken. Present for the meeting were Cherry County Commissioners Tanya Storer, Martin DeNaeyer, James Ward, and Cherry County Clerk Brittny Petersen. The Open Meetings Act Poster was acknowledged by Chairman Storer and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The Board of Commissioners regular meeting minutes from December 31, 2019 were read. Commissioner DeNaeyer moved to approve the minutes as read. Commissioner Ward seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Ward-aye. The motion carried.

The Board conducted their annual reorganization for 2020.

Commissioner Ward moved to appoint Commissioner Storer as the Board Chairman and Commissioner DeNaeyer as the Board Vice-Chairman for 2020. Commissioner DeNaeyer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Ward-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. The motion carried.

Commissioner Ward seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Ward-aye. The motion carried.

Commissioner DeNaeyer moved to designate Valentine Midland News and the Cherry County Website (www.co.cherry.ne.us) as the official Cherry County Publications for 2020. Commissioner Storer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Ward-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. The motion carried.

The Board reviewed a request from the Cherry County Visitor Promotion Board for the reduction of available funds in the Petty Cash account and the minutes from their meeting on December 3, 2019 approving the reduction. All funds in excess of the limit will be remitted to the Cherry County Treasurer. Commissioner Storer moved to reduce the Cherry County Visitor Promotion petty cash checking account from \$8,000 to \$2,000. Commissioner Ward seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Wardaye. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. The motion carried.

The Board discussed Cherry County employee cost-of-living adjustments as previously budgeted. Cherry County Assessor Betty Daugherty and Cherry County Treasurer Kathy Hammond met with the Board to discuss COLA for their respective employees.





Commissioner Ward moved to approve cost-of-living adjustments of 3%, effective January 1, 2020, for Cherry County employees as reflected by the 2019-2020 Cherry County budget. Commissioner Storer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Ward-aye. The motion carried.

Treasurer Hammond presented the Cherry County Treasurer's Semi-Annual Statement for the period of July 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019. Fund balances and PILT payments were discussed. No Board action was required.

Ed Knott, Applied Connective President, met with the Board to update them regarding the state of IT for Cherry County. At 11:06 AM Commissioner Ward moved to enter executive session for the purpose of discussing Cherry County security and cybersecurity with the Board, County Clerk, Communications Director Gary Weaver, and Mr. Knott to be present. Commissioner Storer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Ward-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. The motion carried.

At 11:14 AM it was a consensus of the Board for Cherry County Justice Center Administrator Sharon Hesse to join the executive session.

At 11:54 AM Commissioner Storer moved to return to open session. Commissioner Ward seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Ward-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. The motion carried.

Commissioner Storer moved to authorize Commissioner DeNaeyer to sign a letter of engagement with L&B Johnson, P.C. for the preparation of 2019 tax returns for KPCC Housing Corp. Commissioner Ward seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Ward-aye. The motion carried.

The Board reviewed a letter from John Wheeler. Commissioner DeNaeyer moved to accept Mr. Wheeler's resignation from the Cherry County Planning Commission. Commissioner Storer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner DeNaeyeraye. Commissioner Ward-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. The motion carried. The Board thanked Mr. Wheeler for his years of service and dedication.

Zoning Administrator Jessica Coyle previously communicated to the Board that Duane Kime and Chelsea Luthy were willing to continue to serve on the Planning Commission. Commissioner DeNaeyer moved to reappoint Duane Kime and Chelsea Luthy to the Cherry County Planning Commission to three-year terms set to expire on January 11, 2023. Commissioner Storer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Ward-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. The motion carried.

From 12:01 PM to 1:05 PM the Board recessed for lunch.

At 1:05 PM, during the allotted time, the Board received comments from the public.

After speaking with Cherry County Attorney Eric Scott via telephone, Commissioner Storer moved to authorize a payment of \$3,312.35 to Board of Education Lands and Funds as a Right-of-Way acquisition for 4.33 acres located in Section 16-34-25W, Cherry County, Nebraska for the construction of TCSP 16(36) Niobrara River Road Project. Commissioner DeNaeyer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Ward-abstain. Commissioner Storer-aye. The motion carried.

The Board reviewed legislation enacted in 2014 regarding the election or appointment of county surveyors in counties having a population under 150,000 inhabitants. Commissioner DeNaeyer moved to set the time and date for a public hearing regarding election of the County Surveyor to be held at 11:00 AM on January 28, 2020 during their regular meeting. Commissioner Storer seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Ward-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. The motion carried.

Commissioner Storer moved set the time and date for a public hearing to amend the Cherry County 2019-2020 budget to be held at 11:15 AM on January 28, 2020 during their regular meeting. Commissioner Ward seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner Storer-aye. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Ward-aye. The motion carried.

Emergency Manager Gary Weaver met with the Board to discuss FEMA reimbursement progress and to provide informal bids from South Dakota Federal Surplus and Tehrani Motors for the purchase of a used pickup. Commissioner DeNaeyer moved to authorize Mr. Weaver to proceed with the negotiation and purchase of a 2011 Dodge Ram 1500 from South Dakota Federal Surplus to be used by the Cherry County Road Superintendent, with the expense to be paid out of the Inheritance Tax Fund. Commissioner Ward seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Commissioner DeNaeyer-aye. Commissioner Ward-aye. Commissioner Storer-aye. The motion carried.

From 2:27 PM to 3:11 PM the Board toured the Courthouse to gather information for the possibility of relocating the County's postage meter and a potential office space for the Cherry County Road Superintendent.

The Board reviewed the Clerk of the District Court fee report from December 2019, the Treasurer fund balances from December 2019, the Sheriff's 4th Quarter Fee Report, a NIRMA ASSIST grant award letter for the purchase of hi-visibility jackets for the County Road Department employees, and written correspondence from Sherri Bacon.



At 2:27 PM, with no further business to come before the Board, Chairman Storer declared the meeting adjourned.



BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MINUTES Emergency Meeting March 20, 2020

The Cherry County Board of Commissioners met in emergency session on March 20, 2020 at 3:30 PM in the Sheriff's Meeting Room of the Cherry County Courthouse. Notice of meeting was posted 24 hours in advance on the Cherry County Website, the Courthouse Doors, the Valentine Public Library, and the Post Office. The notice of the meeting was sent to media, KVSH & KSDZ radio, which had requested notification of such emergency meetings. The meeting was called to order at 3:30 PM by Chairman Storer. Roll call was taken. Present for the meeting were Cherry County Commissioners Tanya Storer, Martin DeNaeyer, James Ward, and Cherry County Deputy Clerk Elise Hamling. The recitation of Pledge of Allegiance was waived. The location of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was acknowledged by Chairman Storer.

The purpose for this emergency meeting was to discuss and act upon COVID-19 Cherry County Action Plan.

Information was shared by the Board members in regard to teleconferences attended. The Board would like for people to refer to the North Central District Health Department, Center for Disease Control and World Health Organization for all information regarding COVID-19, and urge the public to follow their recommendations.

The Board discussed the Governor's executive order regarding giving Public Boards the Flexibility to Hold Virtual Meetings (ref. EO 20-03 – Corona Virus-Public Meetings), the potential utilization of this order, and some advice received from the Nebraska Association of County Officials.

The Board discussed with Cherry County Emergency Manager Gary Weaver the plans and actions of other local agencies, their efforts in regard to COVID-19, and the measures being taken and supplies being acquired and shared.

The Board discussed with Cherry County Road Superintendent Kent Lopez the protocol expected for all three road districts in Cherry County. All Road Employees are to wipe down all contact areas of all equipment and machinery both before and after use with a minimum of 10% concentrated disinfectant solution. Employees are expected to adhere to all relevant Center for Disease Control guidelines/suggestions in regard to COVID-19 prevention/risk reduction measures.

It was the consensus of the Board to approve the aforementioned protocol for COVID-19 prevention/risk reduction measures for the Cherry County Road Employees.

The Board discussed the separate closure procedure of the Court System in Cherry County from the rest of the Courthouse Offices. Both County and District Court closures would occur only by explicit order of the Chief Justice of the Nebraska Supreme Court.

The Board discussed with Cherry County Emergency Manager Gary Weaver the plans in the event that he were unable to fulfill his duties, Cherry County Sheriff Rusty Osburn is the designated alternate. Mr. Weaver reassured the Board that Sheriff Osburn remains up to date on all pertinent information in regard to Emergency Management.

In an effort to ensure that Cherry County will be eligible for any future potential federal or state disaster relief funding pertaining to the COVID-19 Declared State of Emergency the Cherry County Commissioners discussed declaring a Cherry County State of Emergency as prescribed by Nebraska Statute 81-829.50. DeNaeyer moved and Ward seconded to approve the Cherry County State of Emergency Declaration and to authorize the Chairman to sign said declaration. Roll call vote: Ayes – DeNaeyer, Ward, Storer. The motion carried.

The Board discussed with Assessor Daugherty, Treasurer Hammond and Deputy Clerk Hamling the ability for County Offices to be able to continue function of their offices via phone, email and mail.

Ward moved and DeNaeyer Seconded a motion to limit the Cherry County Courthouse to non-public access. All elected officials will continue to conduct business telephonically, electronically and by mail, and if necessary, conduct individual appointments on a case by case basis. The courthouse will continue to offer necessary services. Roll call vote: Ayes – Ward, Storer, DeNaeyer. The motion carried.

At 5:45 PM, with no further business to come before the Board, Chairman Storer declared the meeting adjourned.

The meeting was called to order at 10:03 AM by Chairman Storer. Roll call was taken. Present for the meeting were Cherry County Commissioners Tanya Storer, Martin DeNaeyer, James Ward, and Cherry County Clerk Brittny Petersen. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and the location of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was acknowledged by Chairman Storer.

The Board of Commissioners regular meeting minutes from March 31, 2020 were read. It was moved by DeNaeyer and seconded by Ward to approve the minutes as read. Roll call vote: Ayes – Storer, DeNaeyer, Ward. The motion carried.

The Board of Corrections meeting minutes from March 31, 2020 were read. It was moved by DeNaeyer and seconded by Ward to approve the minutes as read. Roll call vote: Ayes – DeNaeyer, Ward, Storer. The motion carried.

Storer moved and DeNaeyer seconded the reappointment of Hollie Hanna to the Sawyer Memorial Library Board of Trustees to a 5-year term set to expire on December 31, 2024. Roll call vote: Ayes – Ward, Storer, DeNaeyer. The motion carried. At the request of the Sawyer Memorial Library Board, the Commissioners will delay appointing a replacement for the remainder of Alice Dawson's term.

Building & Grounds Superintendent Pat Greenough met with the Board to discuss the need for a replacement window air conditioning unit in the Sawyer Memorial Library. It was a consensus of the Board to authorize Mr. Greenough to proceed with the purchase and installation of a new air conditioning unit. Courthouse cleaning and sanitization supplies were discussed. 





At 2:01 PM Chairman Storer opened the public hearing to hear testimony regarding an application for tax exemption on real and personal property by qualifying organizations.

Assessor Daugherty recommended approval of the exemption application as applied for by the Berean Fundamental Church of Valentine for Lot 2 Block 1 Good Samaritan Addition to the City of Valentine, Cherry County, Nebraska. No one from the public appeared in response to the application.

Comments from the public were received by the Board during the allotted time.



Clarification is needed prior to being able to compare the potential replacement vehicles.

Commissioner Storer reached out to Jada Thompson, Contryman Associates, the company who performs Cherry County's annual audits, in order to seek guidance on acquiring and trading vehicles for the Sheriff's Department. Jada confirmed that it is acceptable to perform a trade to replace the vehicle according to state laws.

The meeting was called to order at 10:24 AM by Vice-Chairman DeNaeyer. Roll call was taken. Present for the meeting were Cherry County Commissioners Martin DeNaeyer, James Ward, and Cherry County Clerk Brittny Petersen. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and the location of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was acknowledged by Vice-Chairman DeNaeyer.

The Board of Commissioners regular meeting minutes from December 8, 2020 were read. DeNaeyer moved and Ward seconded to approve the minutes as read. Roll call vote: Ayes – DeNaeyer, Ward. Absent – Storer. The motion carried.

Cherry County Road Superintendent Kent Lopez provided an estimate for labor and materials for a parking lot north of Sawyer Memorial Library from Daugherty Construction.

Commissioner Tanya Storer joined the meeting at 10:57 AM.

At 11:00 AM, as per notice published in the Valentine Midland News on December 16, 2020, Chairman Storer opened the public hearing for Application for Liquor License as applied for by Snake River Founders, LLC DBA CapRock Ranch. No one appeared in support of or protest against the issuance of such license. At 11:15 AM Chairman Storer closed the public hearing.

Storer moved and DeNaeyer seconded to recommend approval for the liquor license as applied for by Snake River Founders, LLC DBA CapRock Ranch to the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission. Roll call vote: Ayes – Ward, Storer, DeNaeyer. The motion carried.

At 11:35 AM, as per notice published in the Valentine Midland News on December 16, 2020 and December 23, 2020, Chairman Storer opened the public hearing for CUP 003/20 Bow & Arrow Ranch, LLC Conservation Easement. Bow & Arrow Ranch, LLC Manager Tom Davis and Nebraska Land Trust Stewardship Director, Jacob Alishouse, appeared on behalf of the applicant in support of the CUP application. The Board requested the baseline documentation reports and conservation banking agreement referenced in the conservation easements. The Board had questions regarding the value of the easement and various items contained in the easements. Cherry County Zoning Administrator Jessica Coyle stated that the Planning Commission had recommended approval of the CUP at their November 12, 2020 meeting, but that no comments were provided. No public testimony was offered during the public hearing. At 12:11 PM Chairman Storer closed the public hearing.

The Board recessed for lunch from 12:13 PM to 1:10 PM.

No comments from the public were received during the allotted time.

Cherry County Highway Superintendent Lloyd Smith informed the Board that after a sign review conducted on the Sparks River Road by Tim Baxter, NIRMA Road Safety and Loss Prevention Specialist, that Mr. Baxter recommends that Cherry County hire an engineering firm to conduct a curve speed study. Mr. Smith will check with Paul Kieper at NDOT to see if any project funds remain that might be used to pay for the speed study. Mr. Smith also informed the Board that from here forward the County is 100% responsible for the cost of bridge inspections.

At the request of the County Clerk, the Board discussed changing the date of the first meeting in February due to a special election. It was a consensus of the Board to change the meeting date from February 9, 2021 to February 8, 2021.

Tom Davis and Jacob Alishouse returned to the meeting on behalf of Bow & Arrow Ranch, LLC. The conservation banking agreement and baseline documentation reports were provided to the Board via email. Storer moved and DeNaeyer seconded to table the agenda item re: Zoning Resolution #Z-83 CUP 003/20 Bow & Arrow Ranch, LLC pending review of additional information until the January 12, 2021 meeting. Roll call vote: Ayes — Storer, DeNaeyer, Ward. The motion carried.

The Board and Cherry County Attorney Eric Scott spoke with Mark Kovar NDOT District 8 Engineer via telephone. The amounts for easements and damages as previously provided in appraisal review reports and administrative settlement amounts were confirmed with Mr. Kovar. Storer moved and DeNaeyer seconded to approve the proposed acquisition contracts and administrative settlements offered to Cherry County by NDOT for Project #83-4(117) for Tracts 3, 35, and 39 pending preparation of final agreements by NDOT and review by Cherry County Attorney Eric Scott. Commissioner Ward is hereby authorized to execute the final agreements on behalf of Cherry County. Roll call vote: Ayes – DeNaeyer, Ward, Storer. The motion carried.


At 4:02 PM, as advertised, the Board recessed from regular session to convene as a Board of Corrections. At 4:58 PM the Board returned to regular session.

BOARD OF CORRECTIONS MINUTES December 29, 2020

The Cherry County Board of Commissioners met as a Board of Corrections on December 29, 2020 in the Sheriff's Conference Room of the Cherry County Courthouse, as per notice published every Wednesday in the Valentine Midland News, with the agenda being on file in the office of the County Clerk. The meeting was called to order at 4:02 PM by Chairman Storer. Roll call was taken. Present for the meeting were Cherry County Commissioners Tanya Storer, Martin DeNaeyer, James Ward, and Cherry County Clerk Brittny Petersen. The location of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was acknowledged by Chairman Storer.

The Board of Corrections meeting minutes from November 24, 2020 were read and approved during the regular Board of Commissioners meeting on December 8, 2020.

Cherry County Justice Center employee, David Stoeger, met with the Board to discuss streamlining the phone system for incoming calls. Currently all calls for Valentine Police Department and the Sheriff's Department are answered first by Dispatch. The issue will be discussed further with Cherry County Communications Director Gary Weaver. No Board action was taken.

Cherry County Justice Center Administrator Sharon Hesse provided the Board with quotes for a new dishwasher for the Justice Center kitchen.
