BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MINUTES January 12, 2021

The Cherry County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on January 12, 2021 at 10:00 AM in the Sheriff's Conference Room of the Cherry County Courthouse, as per notice published every Wednesday in the Valentine Midland News, with the agenda being on file in the office of the County Clerk. The meeting was called to order at 10:00 AM by Chairman Storer. Roll call was taken. Present for the meeting were Cherry County Commissioners Tanya Storer, Martin DeNaeyer, James Ward, and Cherry County Clerk Brittny Petersen. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and the location of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was acknowledged by Chairman Storer.

The Board of Commissioners regular meeting minutes from December 29, 2020 were read. DeNaeyer moved and Ward seconded to approve the minutes as read. Roll call vote: Aye – Storer, DeNaeyer, Ward. The motion carried.

The Board of Corrections meeting minutes from December 29, 2020 were read. Ward moved and Storer seconded to approve the minutes as read. Roll call vote: Aye – DeNaeyer, Ward, Storer. The motion carried.

Cherry County Highway Superintendent Lloyd Smith informed the Board that there are not any funds remaining from the Sparks River Road Project, for which the Board requested a closeout financial report from NDOT. Superintendent Smith has spoken to an engineer regarding fracture critical bridge inspections throughout the county and a speed study for Sparks River Road. The board requested Superintendent Smith to inquire with NIRMA to ascertain whether the county would qualify for a grant to pay for the signs on Sparks River Road.

The Board conducted their annual reorganization for 2021.

Ward moved and Storer seconded to nominate Commissioner DeNaeyer as the Board Vice-Chairman for 2021. Roll call vote: Aye – Ward, Storer, DeNaeyer. The motion carried.

Ward moved and DeNaeyer seconded to nominate Commissioner Storer as the Board Chairman for 2021. Roll call vote: Aye – Storer, DeNaeyer, Ward. The motion carried.

Ward moved and DeNaeyer seconded to designate Valentine Midland News and the Cherry County website (www.co.cherry.ne.us) as the official Cherry County publications for meeting notices and other required notifications for 2021. Roll call vote: Aye – Storer, DeNaeyer, Ward. The motion carried.

The Board reviewed an agreement for highway superintendent services as provided by Superintendent Smith. Storer moved and Ward seconded to appoint Lloyd Smith as the Cherry County Highway Superintendent for 2021 and enter into a one-year agreement as set forth. Roll call vote: Aye – DeNaeyer, Ward, Storer. The motion carried.

The Board discussed Cherry County employee cost-of-living adjustments as previously budgeted. Storer moved and DeNaeyer seconded to approve a 2.5% cost-of-living-adjustment, effective January 1, 2021, for Cherry County employees. Roll call vote: Aye – Ward, Storer, DeNaeyer. The motion carried.

Cherry County Treasurer Kathy Hammond presented the semi-annual statement for the 6-month period ended December 31, 2020 to the Board for review. DeNaeyer moved and Ward seconded to approve the semi-annual report as presented by Treasurer Hammond. Roll call vote: Aye – Storer, DeNaeyer, Ward. The motion carried.

Cherry County Zoning Administrator Jessica Coyle met with the Board to discuss public hearing dates for CUP 004/20 Shane Daniels Amendment of Conservation Easement. Administrator Coyle stated that she had previously provided the Cherry County Planning Commission meeting minutes from January 5, 2021 to the Board via email. Based on attendance for the Planning Commission's public hearing for CUP 004/20 Administrator Coyle stated that the regular meeting date and room should be sufficient for the Board's public hearing. DeNaeyer moved and Storer seconded to set the public hearing date for CUP 004/20 Shane Daniels Amendment of Conservation Easement for February 8, 2020 at 11:00 AM during their regularly scheduled meeting. Roll call vote: Aye – DeNaeyer, Ward, Storer. The motion carried.

Potential public hearing dates for CUP 001/20 Danielski Harvesting & Farming, LLC/Valentine Feeders Swine Facility were discussed. Administrator Coyle recommended a special meeting date and stated the Courtroom provided adequate space for those in attendance during the Planning Commission's public hearing. The Board requested that any available Planning Commission members be present for the public hearing. DeNaeyer moved and Storer seconded to set the public hearing for February 11, 2020 at 2:00 PM in the Cherry County Courthouse Courtroom for CUP 001/20 Danielski Harvesting & Farming, LLC/Valentine Feeders Swine Facility. Roll call vote: Aye – Ward, Storer, DeNaeyer. The motion carried.

Tom Davis - Bow & Arrow Ranch, LLC General Manager, Preston Smith - Wildwood Environmental Credit Company Managing Member, Jacob Alishouse - Nebraska Land Trust Stewardship Director, and Carl Simmons - Nebraska Land Trust Board Member, met with the Board to discuss CUP 003/20 Bow & Arrow Ranch, LLC Conservation Easement. During the Board's review of the conservation easements at their last meeting, additional documents were requested and received, including Baseline Documentation Reports, E.L. Spencer Jr. Conservation Area Permittee Responsible Conservation Plan, and a Conservation Bank Agreement. Questions and concerns regarding the conservation purpose of the easements, confirmation that the easements are not in conflict with the county's comprehensive land use plan, ensuring that there are no negative impacts for adjoining landowners, the ability to amend easements, the definition of traditional livestock, and taxation & assessment values were raised by the Board. The information received by the Board during their last meeting will be sent to the Planning Commission to determine if it conflicts with the county's comprehensive land use plan and if there are any risks or adverse effects to neighboring lands.

Storer moved and Ward seconded to send CUP #003/20 back to the Planning Commission for review including Baseline Documentation Reports, E.L. Spencer Jr. Conservation Area Permittee Responsible Conservation Plan, and the Conservation Bank Agreement to give a thorough review and recommendation based on all information provided to the Board of Commissioners regarding the Bow & Arrow Ranch, LLC Conservation Easements. Roll call vote: Aye – Storer, Ward. Nay – DeNaeyer. The motion carried.

Cherry County Emergency Manager Gary Weaver and Cherry County Road Superintendent Kent Lopez met with the Board to discuss the status of FEMA reimbursement submissions for county road repairs. The deadline and process for submitting appeals to FEMA were also discussed. No Board action was required at this time.

The Board recessed for lunch from 12:04 PM to 1:00 PM.

Comments from the public were received during the allotted time.

The Board reviewed the Clerk of the District Court fee report from December 2020, Treasurer's fund balance listing from December 31, 2020, Operating Statement report of budget vs actual spending for December 2020, Cherry County Hospital Balance Sheets from November 30, 2020, and the Sheriff's Quarterly Fee Report for 4th Quarter 2020.

At 2:00 PM, as advertised, the Board recessed from regular session to convene as a Board of Equalization. At 2:08 PM the Board returned to regular session.
